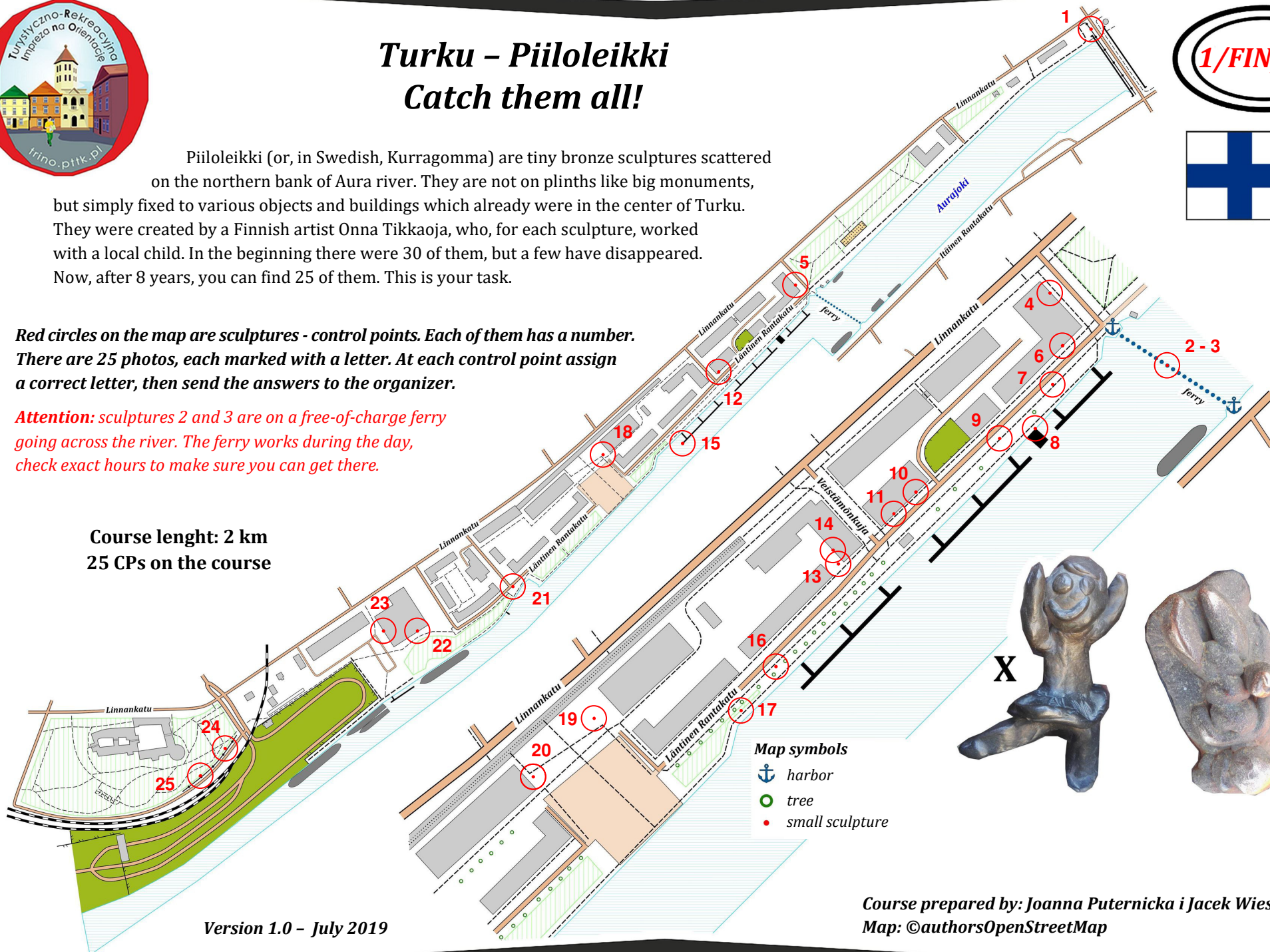


Piiloleikki (or, in Swedish, Kurragomma) are tiny bronze sculptures scattered on the northern bank of Aura river. They are not on plinths like big monuments, but simply fixed to various objects and buildings which already were in the center of Turku. They were created by a Finnish artist Onna Tikkaaja, who, for each sculpture, worked with a local child. In the beginning there were 30 of them, but a few have disappeared. Now, after 8 years, you can find 25 of them. This is your task.

Red circles on the map are sculptures - control points. Each of them has a number. There are 25 photos, each marked with a letter. At each control point assign a correct letter, then send the answers to the organizer.

Attention: sculptures 2 and 3 are on a free-of-charge ferry going across the river. The ferry works during the day, check exact hours to make sure you can get there.

Course length: 2 km
